Another highlight has been our partnership with **Breaking the ICE (BTI)**.

BTI hosts consumer-focused events for people who use **Alternative and Augmentative Communication (AAC)**. **ICE stands for Independence, Community and Empowerment**. The goal is to provide individuals who use AAC opportunities to come together and learn from each other, create meaningful relationships in the community, and have a platform to share ideas and feelings.

The BTI team has reinstated their in-person events in Ontario which have been a great success. With the help of ISAAC Canada it is the hope that BTI may once again expand to ICE West (in BC) and ICE Alberta. 4. To continue to engage in Advocacy activities as they pertain to issues for persons who need AAC across Canada.
5. To re-design our Website to reflect the ongoing work and direction of ISAAC Canada and to make the website accessible in both English and French.



### A Canadian AAC Conference?

This executive has regularly discussed the possibility of doing ISAAC Canada conferences in the way Australia does the AGOSCI Conferences – every two years with the conference moving from Zone to Zone around the country.

ISAAC Canada would need commitment from the ISAAC Canada membership and a committee to be struck to begin to explore the options, costs, logistics etc.
